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Reading

- In KS2 we encourage the children to **choose their own books** to help them become more responsible for their own learning and develop a **real love for reading**.
- Please encourage your child to read at home and ask them questions.
- Children are allowed to bring in their own books or a library book to read at school. Please remind your child that it's their responsibility to look after it.



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Physical Education

- Children are required to have a FULL P.E. kit at school. Children also need to have tracksuit bottoms in their PE kits and a pair of shorts. Shirts need to be plain white and unbranded, or the school's P.E kit. Items of clothing need to be labelled with the child's name and class/year group
- Trainers must not have studs unless its for Sports Club.
- P.E. bags will be kept in school for 2 or 3 weeks. They can then be taken home for washing.
- If your child attends a sports club, please ensure that they bring in their PE kit on the following day.
- Karas need to be covered with a sweatband.



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Home Learning

- 'Home learning' will include spellings and handwriting.
- The homework will alternate between English and Maths weekly.
- Please ensure that you regularly check your child's 'home learning' books to ensure that the homework has been completed.
- It is essential that children read on a daily basis. Please ensure that you support your child. Please sign your child's reading record.
- Homework will be given out on Friday and is expected to come back on Monday.
- Spelling test will be done on a Thursday



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Reading Journals

- During the week children will be set reading journals tasks.
- Reading Journals will be given on a Friday and should be returned by Tuesday.
- The work set is essential for your child's learning so please make sure the work is completed and handed in on time.
- If homework or reading journal tasks are handed in late they will NOT be marked.



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Trips

- Autumn: Roman Tours to visit our school. Linked to History.
- Spring: Natural History Museum linked to Science
- Summer Term: Theatre, linked to English. Focus on play scripts.



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Water Bottles and Fruit

- Please ensure lunches are healthy and sufficient.
- Children are required to bring a **labelled** water bottle to school which will be kept in the classroom.
- Children in KS2 do not receive 'free fruit'. If you would like your child to have fruit during playtime, please provide them with a small amount of fruit in a small box.
- Please ensure that you label water bottles & fruit boxes
- If your child brings in a packed lunch, then please make sure that they bring in a separate water bottle & fruit box
- Children in KS2 do not receive 'free milk'. Parents can contact 'Cool Milk' if they would like their child to have milk at school.



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Attendance

- Please ensure your child arrives on time. Gates open at 8.30am
- Registers close at 8.40am
- If your child is absent, please call on the first day of sickness and follow up with a written letter when your child returns



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Home Time

- Please collect children from their specified location
- **Year 3 children** are to be collected from the hall. They will remain in a line until the class teacher sees the parent and will then send out the children.
- **Please be patient and do not crowd the doors.**
