English – Reading

This term, we are reading the novel: *The World's Worst Children*

In reading lessons, children will continue to develop their skills with retrieval and inference.

They will read a variety of fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts.



English – Writing

Writing to entertain – we will write a short story based on a child from *The World's Worst Children*.

Writing to inform – we will write an explanation text on volcanoes and Earthquakes.

Grammar

We will continue to build on and expand upon the children's knowledge of grammar, looking especially this term at:

- **Expanded Noun Phrases**
- **Organising paragraphs around a theme**

Spellings:

- **Prefixes – in/im/il/ir**
- **Homophones**
- **Year 4 Statutory spelling words/topic words**

Sikh Studies - The Ten Gurus

We will be learning about what Guru Arjun Dev Ji's and Hargobind Sahib Ji's key messages were and how their lives affect how Sikhs celebrate Bandhi Chorr Diwas today.



Geography – Why do some countries have volcanoes and earthquakes?

We will be learning all about Italy and why there are many volcanoes in the area; how Volcanoes are formed and the effects of earthquakes.



Religious Education - What can we learn from religions about what is right and wrong.

We will be describing and comparing the rules and teachings from different religions; recalling and explaining stories which demonstrate morality and explain the reasons for rules in religions.

Computing - Digital Literacy (How do we keep safe online?)

We will discuss key online safety 'rules', what may be unacceptable behaviour, and where to go/report it if a problem arises. We will also create and share some information online demonstrating need to be respectful and safe.

Art – Pop Art

Science

This half term we will cover the topic: **Sound**

We will be learning all about how sounds are made and how they travel.
