Communication and Language

Children will learn to:

- Describe events in detail.
- Offer explanation for why things might happen, making use of recently introduced vocabulary from stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems.
- Express their ideas and feelings about their experiences using full sentences, including use of past, present and future tenses and making use of conjunctions.



Sikh Studies

- Visit the Darbar Sahib
- Talk about the importance of the Darbar Sahib

Parents can help at home by visiting the Gurdwara and talking about significant things in the Gurdwara.



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Work towards a set goal.
- Show understanding of their own feelings and those of others, and begin to regulate their behaviour accordingly.
- Be confident to try new activities.
- Manage own basic hygiene and personal needs.

Parents can encourage goal-setting and help children manage emotions and behavior. They can also support confidence in new activities and personal hygiene routines.

Literacy

Children will read the following stories:

- Supertato
- A Superpower Like Mine
- Superworm
- There's a Superhero in Your Book
- A Superhero Like You

Children will learn the following songs:

- Superhero Song
- Let's be a Superhero
- People Who Help us Song
- Community Helpers Song



In phonics, children will:

- Learn the sounds of diagraphs
- Read and write CVC words such as rain, ship, boat.
- Write sentences such as: The ship is red and black.

Parents can help at home by practicing letter sounds, ask your child to segment (robot) words and practice writing words.

Expressive Arts and Design

Children will use a range of instruments to create:

- Creating Superhero costumes
- Modelling
- Designing superhero shields



Children will learn different animal songs

Parents can encourage children to be creative at home through drawing/painting pictures and singing songs about superheroes.

Physical Development

- Know and talk different factors that support their overall health and wellbeing:
 - Regular exercise
 - Healthy eating
 - Tooth brushing
 - Sleep routine
 - Screen time
 - Road safety
- Move like a superhero!



Parents can help at home by encouraging exercise, healthy eating, tooth brushing, and a good sleep routine, while also teaching road safety and managing screen time.

Mathematics

Number:

- Exploring composition of numbers to 10
- Number bonds to 5
- Number bonds to 10
- Adding numbers
- Doubling
- Subtraction
- Sharing



Numerical Patterns:

- Repeated shape patterns
- Time
- Shape
- Exploring and comparing length, weight and capacity
- Composition of shape

Parents can help by using everyday activities to explore numbers, addition, subtraction, doubling, and sharing. They can also support pattern recognition through shapes, time, and comparing size and weight in daily life.

Punjabi

Pupils will have a Punjabi lesson every week which is taught by a specialist teacher. Children will learn to write Punjabi words and talk in sentences.

Understanding the World

Children will learn about:

- Superheroes and their powers
- Compare Fictional Superheroes with real people
- Identify real life superheroes and their strengths.

Parents can support learning by discussing pet care and comparing local wildlife to global animals through books, videos, and park visits.
